Foreign policy initiatives may arise in either branch, and each branch bears a responsibility to deal with the other in good faith on foreign policy questions. Each branch must also provide a check on the other. In an operational sense, Congress should work in cooperation with the Executive in ensuring that the foreign policy of the Nation reflects the values and principles we as a nation espouse – foreign policy should be fair, just and equitable.</i></p>

ESSAY		<p>Comment on the necessity &amp; effectiveness of our military deployment in Afghanistan</p> <p><i>I believe that our action in Afghanistan should have been focused from the onset solely on the pursuit of al Qaeda with the goal of effectively disrupting its operational capabilities in that country. The broader objective that was undertaken, the dismantling of the oppressive Afghan Taliban government, while perhaps noble in principle, was ill-advised in the absence of a carefully conceived long range plan, and will likely prove, in the long run, not to have resulted in significant long-term benefit to the Afghan people. With al Qaeda's operations there effectively dismantled, the continued presence of U.S. forces is likely to be a destabilizing factor in the region. If our foreign policy were consistent and based on the Afghan and Iraqi models, I fear that we would, in very short order, be involved in the deconstruction and lengthy reconstruction of numerous regimes around the world, all at a cost in blood and treasure that would quickly prove unsustainable.</i></p>

Highways are critical to commerce, and the federal government must play a role, including a funding role, in ensuring that highway systems are adequate to meet commercial needs. Mass transit is of national interest and ought to be improved and expanded because of the environmental benefits of reduced traffic, coupled with a reduced need for highway expansion; and because it often provides the only practical means of transportation for low-income persons, and enables them to access work, education, and other needs. The United States, with its vast geography, ought to be a world leader in high-speed rail, and regular rail service, as provided by Amtrak or similar operations, ought to be expanded and improved. The federal government should be responsible for ensuring air safety and improvements.</i></b></p> <p><b><i>Finally, the private market will not replace a bridge, or rebuild a municipal water system, or reconstruct a dam absent either government funding or, perhaps, ownership rights of what is considered a public good. The need for infrastructure repair and upgrade in the U.S. is immense, the projected costs of needed projects are growing rapidly, and there are workers desperate for jobs. Federal spending on infrastructure projects ought to be undertaken now, and on a nationwide scale.</i></b></p>
