H) As concisely as possible, please state why you feel you should be endorsed over the other candidate(s). What goals for the office you seek are most important to you personally?

Stated simply, I have the academic background, political and governmental experience, personal temperment and public policy track record which is necessary to sustain the progress that we have made in the 38th District and in the Southland region as a whole. Whatever success that I have achieved is based upon being able to work with local governments, community and civic organizations and constituents to collectively address the concerns of the south suburbs. That continuity of service has to continue; our work is far from over. The practice of fiscal prudence and pragmatism, insuring a well-managed "safety net" for the elderly, disabled and indigent, continuing to fight for equality in the distribution of resources; all of these things are crucial to the Southland. That's the answer to the question of how one manages legislative responsibilities during one of the most fiscally challenging times that Illinois has faced. Since 2010, I've been fortunate to have accomplished many of the goals that I had previously set for the District. Some of our local municipalities have acquired land for public safety access through the legislative process. Others will be able to showcase prime land for economic development purposes. Don't forget the importance of transportation. Efficient modes of transportation are a prerequisite to many other important issues: How long does it take to get to work? Can vehicular traffic and commerce efficiently traverse through our region? Many of those issues are on the "road" to being addressed; through legislative and extra-legislative means. Many of our major roads have been resurfaced or in many cases, reconstructed. On a major note, Senator Toi Hutchinson and I passed a bill creating the Southeast Commuter Rail Transit District; the necessary precursor to the new Metra Southeast Service Line. What was once deemed improbable is now in the planning stages; a new commuter rail line from downtown Chicago to Crete, spurring economic development, and the efficient flow of commuters to the Chicago central business district.

Of course, there is the responsibility of lawmaking. I continue my work with local, county, state officials and constituents to advance our unique needs through the legislative process. Frankly, that work has been enjoyable and has borne much fruit. We have passed

legislation dealing with job training and development, consumer protection, elder fraud and abuse, child abuse prevention, care for those in need of mental health and developmental disability services, patients' rights, the unique needs of Illinois' returning service personnel, governmental efficiency and much, much more. Some of the important regional development projects we talked about last year have gone from the planning stages to developmental design or commencement. These include the Dixie Square Mall demolition and development project, the I57/I294 Bridge and interchange projects and access road development in the Harvey Intermodal Facility project. In addition, over 2,700 acres of the land needed for the "inaugural footprint" for the South Suburban Airport has been acquired. Much of the updated planning documents such as wetland studies, aeronautical forecasts and alternatives development plans been submitted to the Army Corps of Engineers and U.S. Department of Transportation. But, with all of the progress we have made, there will be issues that I will always work to address. Work has been done addressing school reform. A concomitant issue should be addressing the inherent inequities in funding our elementary and secondary schools. Parallel to this discussion would naturally be an evaluation of Illinois' counterproductive tax system and property tax relief for our local municipalities.

Finally, the General Assembly passed HB5424 which, among other things, implemented a budgeting strategy generally known as "Budgeting for Outcomes". This concept is not new, as we remember concepts such as Zero Based Budgeting from the 1970s. In these times of fiscal exigency, the concept of tying available revenue to a set of desired "outcomes" i.e. programs and projects makes all the sense in the world. One must remember however, that over 3 billion dollars had been cut from the state budget over the last two years prior to HB5424's passage. I always speak about prudence and pragmatism which is important here. These systems rely heavily on creating effective measures or "metrics" which will effectively quantify the performance of a particular unit of service or program. As a statistician, I can tell you that one must also take care to apply qualitative evaluations of the budget at the same time. This is to prevent unintended consequences that "cuts by formula" might render, especially to human services, public safety or educational programs whose beneficial outcomes make be slower to discern. We saw this recently as the General Assembly and Governor had to "reappropriate" funds to insure that major needs of the state were addressed, post facto. My pledge is that I will always insure that the budget of the state is fiscally prudent, but also meets the needs of all residents of Illinois. This is not a contradiction in terms or a representation of mutually exclusive goals, but a promise that I plan to keep as the State Representative of the 38th District.

I) What is your campaign budget? How much have you raised to date?

My campaign budget for the primary is about \$50,000. I've raised about \$25,000 so far.

I have one part time person on my campaign staff to date. I have about 110 volunteers.
