As a former intelligence analyst who served most of his military career in the Middle East, I bring an understanding of both the intelligence process and an understanding of the complex political environment in the Middle East.

I was born and raised in Monrovia, Liberia, West Africa. I look at the world from a cross-cultural perspective. I have the ability to adapt my speech and presentation to better communicate with others from a different background.

Dennis Kucinich for President 2004: I started off as an event coordinator in Bloomington, IL. I later helped coordinate a state-wide ballot access effort while working as Kucinich's Labor Coordinator in Illinois. In Iowa, I was a volunteer coordinator and I helped organize both Kucinich's Door-to-door campaign and GOTV effort. It was too little, too late. I was finally hired on as a volunteer coordinator in the state of Oregon.

David Gill for Congress 2004: I managed the campaign of Dr. David Gill, a Democrat running in Illinois' 15th Congressional District. With \$100K, we were able to increase Gill's standings over the last Democrat to run by 7% points against an entrenched Republican, Tim Johnson.

Tom Whalen for City Council 2005: I worked as a volunteer for Alderman Whalen in Bloomington, IL.

<p>We could continue to work towards a strong UN or UN-like government, but quite frankly, I see these as archaic ways of thinking and I embrace a new view of globalization. The WTO and big business have, without really asking for authority, advanced an agenda of trade agreements that benefit the “ownership society.” As a result, workers and citizens across the globe are powerless against multinational corporations.</p> <p>A better way to combat the form of globalization embraced by the WTO, and a higher priority for me as a Congressman would be to grow the power of unions in the world labor market through a World Economic Organization (WEO). Congress could encourage the growth of such an organization by:</p> <p>1) Only passing trade agreements with countries that join the WEO and only doing business with those countries that encourage the unionization of workers of multinational corporations. 2) Implementing an <i>International Goods Tax</i> (tariffs) on products coming from countries that do not honor the rights of workers or join the WEO. 3) Using the <i>International Goods Tax</i> to fund WEO labor trade schools both in America and abroad. 4) Offering tax breaks to small businesses that stay in America.</p>
